We are a “Family of Faith”

When our Christian Education committee went on visiting about the faith lives of our children--and how it is we can best teach the faith to our little ones—we kept returning to a well know truth: “it’s what happens in the family.” It’s true, study after study has been done showing that if a child doesn’t experience a living faith in the home within which they grow up, they will likely not have a faith as they move into adult hood.

That conversation was powerful for me. It not only has me considering suggesting new ways of doing what we have always called Sunday School, but it got me thinking about our “family” we call Beaver Valley. What is it that people (often like little children wondering about all of it) see in us? How deep are we going as generations of adults in deepening our faith in these sacred hallways? Are we a confident, doing, prospering “family of faith?”

Without answering that question for you, I would say that as we come out of the past year of pandemic (hourly prayers for the many, especially the young now, who are battling current and long-lasting symptoms of the Covid virus) it is a perfect time to do what the women of the church are doing: asking, “How do we come back to life?”

This is as good a time as any that I have experienced to lay just about everything on the table and take a look at it. What from our past do we want to keep and restore post-Covid, and what weaknesses in our practices need to be changed or even simply done away with? This is a fair pairing of questions for every household in our congregation to ask, just as it is a fair and good question for our congregation, as a family of faith to ask. There is nothing to fear. God will guide our best, prayed over efforts. The greatest gift we can pray for this spring will be to simply re-awaken to the fact that our home, individually and here together, is the most important place for God to be at the center of all that we do.



The Give+ Program is operated by Vanco Services, LLC, an industry leader in electronic payment solutions. We have worked with Vanco for several years and are excited to expand our current Simply Giving program. Below you will find step-by-step instructions on how this new Give+ option works.

- 1) Visit our website (www.BeverValleyLutheran.org) and look for the **Simply Giving/Online Giving** button which is located right next to the Sermons Online button. Click to launch the eGiving portal.
- 2) To give a one-time gift to the church, simply complete the form on the page to initiate an electronic debit from your checking or savings account.

Select "General Fund" from the **Select Fund** drop-down box, leave the frequency at "One Time" and enter the amount (in whole dollar amounts). Select the **Add Donation** button and the details of the transaction will display on the screen.

If everything looks correct, select **Next**.


(**Sunday morning 8:30am Chapel will end on May 16th - Wednesday Outdoor Worship will take the place of Sunday Chapel**)

Q1 2021 Unified Budget Recap

It's hard to believe but we are already through the 1st quarter of 2021. The Church Council felt it was important to take a few minutes to provide an update to the congregation on how things are going with the Unified budget so far this year. Details regarding income vs expenses for each category along with the quarterly goals can be found below.

We have found that offering has been down a bit compared to the prior two years which averaged approx. \$69,704 for the first quarter – this is about a 29% reduction. However, our expenses are only about 1% higher than they were at this time last year which is helping to ensure that we don't fall too far behind when we look at incoming offering verses expenses going out of the general fund.

Approval of Prior Meeting Minutes: MMSC: Motion to approve March Minutes was made by Michael Gross and seconded by Linda Wingate. Motion carried.

Approval of Treasurer's Report:

MMSC: Motion to approve the March Treasurers report made by Dave Schnabel and seconded by Kathy Reisenweber.

January through March giving was down from 2020/2019 about 19%. Expenses are expected to go up with Sunday school and other activities resuming at the church.

Greg asked about general fund because we received larger gifts at the beginning of the year and may balance out thru out the year. 5 families made their gifts in January 2020. 63 Families have not gifted yet in 2021.

PPP money that was forgiven was discussed and decided to move to general fund as needed.

Stacy requested that a plan should be made to return money to the memorial fund if there is any money not used for the 150th. Dave discussed removing the mailbox and just using the PO Box. Discussion had of pros and cons. Decided to talk to the post office then remove mail box. Talked about a better address on building and a drop box if needed by the front door.

Kevin thanked David and reminded everyone about treats.

Kevin discussed the seats being filled by the 3 new committee members to make sure there is not too many open seats at the same time. Discussion had to form a committee group to make sure the office knows how to handle the transition of terms of office in the coming years.
