

The month of April invites us to continue on our Lenten journey and get to that April 17th, Easter Sunday shout, "Jesus Christ is risen from the dead!" As this April newsletter attempts to communicate--the story of new beginnings, spring following winter, is best told *to* a child and *by* children.

As this short article is being written, the Christian Education committee and Sunday School director, Brittany and myself wait to see how many of our Sunday School aged children will be involved in the **Sunday, April 10**th, newly written, Holy Week program (A letter was mailed out to all of our parents with little ones on March 24).

Our littlest children, along with some key support from some of our confirmation youth, will help us remember the entire Holy Week story. The program is written in such a way that we can, with few rehearsals, get ready to offer this children-led telling of the entire Holy Week story. But we wait for parents to find out what energies and time and interest that they and theirs have right now.

It will be a festive, all hands on deck morning and I look forward to it for many reasons, but none more than the fact that our children will be in the middle of it all.

Included in this newsletter is a two and half page **Youth Ministry Handbook.** The Christian Education committee wants the entire congregation and parents of children of all ages to carefully read the handbook and know that good planning and serious commitments to our children are in place. The writing of the handbook has been a big piece of work that is moving forward because it must. For we know, that if we next year celebrate 150 years in the *past* without thinking about the 150 years in the *future*, the next generations may not hear the Good News: "Jesus is Risen from the Dead!"

Youth Ministry Handbook

Introduction

"Let the children come to me." Matthew 19:14. Nothing is more important than teaching children the basics of faith.

Christian Education & Other Youth Ministry Programs

Sunday School

- One room school house concept
- Sunday School Director coordinates Sunday School program
- Ages 3-year-old through 4th grade
- Meets after church ends on Sunday mornings (approximately 10:35) for 25—30 minutes
- Ring the bell, attendance chart, prayer, Whirl Bible story, Whirl video and discussion questions, and activity/project.
- Bibles given to 3-year-olds and 3rd graders and any others who have not received a Bible.
- Traditional Christmas program presented/performed during Sunday morning worship and at Bethany Meadows during Sunday School time (if allowed) in December. Simple retelling of the Christmas story and singing of Christmas songs. Practice held on Sunday mornings. Families are asked to help children learn songs which are posted on the church website and Facebook page.

Children's Choir

This is an optional opportunity for Sunday School children. The children's choir practices for 10-15 minutes on Sunday mornings after Sunday School and sings in church approximately once a month during the Sunday School year.

Vacation Bible School

A mini-VBS (one story) is held each summer.

First Communion

- 5th graders and older children who have not yet received first communion.
- Meet a couple of times with Pastor prior to receiving first communion.
- Paint a chalice to commemorate first communion milestone.
- First communion is held on the first Sunday in November.

Bible Camp

Children are encouraged to consider attending Bible camp during the summer.

Confirmation

- 6th-8th graders + fall session for 9th graders
- Meets on Wednesday nights from 6:45 to 7:45 p.m.
- Lead by Pastor with the help of adult mentors/confirmation guides.
- Bible, handbook, and curriculum provided to 6th graders
- "I Send You" curriculum focusing on learning the joy and importance of serving others.
- Servant and 'fun' events incorporated throughout the confirmation year.
- Confirmation Sunday is held on the last Sunday in October.

Youth Ministry Handbook (page 2)

Middle School Youth Group

- 5th 8th graders
- Meets after church ends on Sunday mornings (approximately 10:35) for 25—30 minutes

Senior High Youth Group

- 9th-12th graders
- Meets after church ends on Sunday mornings (approximately 10:35) for 25—30 minutes
- Zoom guests throughout the year will lead devotions.
- Servant and 'fun' events held throughout the year.
- Group faith experience/trip offered every three years.
- Assist with Easter sunrise worship (worship assistants, readers, song leaders).

Volunteering

Opportunities for Adults to Volunteer

Play the video and lead the discussion and activity for 3-year-olds – 1^{st} graders OR 2^{nd} - 4^{th} graders. Serve on the Christian Education committee.

Serve as a Confirmation Guide.

Opportunities for Families to Volunteer

- Help with pasta meal fundraiser in January or February AND/OR Palm Sunday brunch in March or April
 - Planning team

- Sell grocery gift cards after church on Sunday mornings.

Funding - Budget, Fundraising, & Special Funds

Budget

- Sunday School curriculum and supplies, Bibles for 3 year-old's and 3rd graders and any others who have not received a Bible.
- Vacation Bible School curriculum and supplies (advertising, decorations, and food)
- First Communion curriculum and supplies (chalices)
- Confirmation curriculum, Bibles, servant activities, and fun activities/short trips
- Middle School Youth Group curriculum, servant activities, and fun activities/shorter trips

Youth Ministry Handbook (page 3)

Fundraising (Pasta Meal Free Will Donation, Palm Sunday Brunch Free Will Donation, and Grocery Gift Card Sales)

- High School Youth Group curriculum, servant activities, and fun activities/shorter trips
- Bible Camp A portion of Bible camp cost will be paid. The amount provided to each child will be determined based on the amount of funds available and the number of children attending camp. Currently \$200 will be given to each child who attends church camp. This amount will be reviewed by the education committee each year and adjusted if needed.
- Youth Trips (National Youth Gathering or other longer trip) A portion of the cost of longer youth trips will be paid. The amount provided to each youth will be determined based on the amount of funds available and the number of youth going on the trip. Currently \$500 will be given to each youth who attends one of these bigger trips. This amount will be reviewed by the education committee each year and adjusted if needed.
- Donation to International, National, State, & Local Causes/Charities A portion is donated each year to support charities.
- ***Additional funds for camp registration and longer youth trips may be requested by talking to Pastor. He will inform the education committee of the request while keeping the identity of the family requesting funds anonymous.
- ***Additional fundraising may be done by specific groups of youth attending longer youth trips. This fundraising will be coordinated by members of the group and will be completed outside the church (i.e. concessions at an auction, waiting tables at Pizza Ranch, cleaning the Canaries stadium, Optimist Club mailing, etc.). The funds earned will be split between the youth participating in the fundraiser to help fund their trip.

Special Fund (donated by Trudi Roberts)

• Use of the money in this fund is determined by Pastor.

Conclusion

The goal is to provide the opportunity here at Beaver Valley Lutheran for families to find the resources and opportunities to raise children in the faith. We ask for families to support the teaching of children and to be involved throughout the year in support of our Sunday morning activities, as well as occasional fundraising events. We want children to be safe here; to be reminded that they are loved for who they are and that God needs them to live healthy, faithful lives in this world.


