

# **Opportunity:** mission development

I remember my junior high football coach seeming to enjoy offering his young athletes something he called "extra opportunity." This meant, at the end

of practice, another set of wind sprints or extended time pushing blocking sleds. In hindsight, the "opportunity" of which he spoke was painful but really *was* an opportunity to get stronger and to be made more ready for the fourth quarter battles that lie ahead.

The Chinese use the exact same symbol to describe "crisis" and "opportunity". A disruption of any kind, let alone a cataclysmic one, is indeed an opportunity to rebuild or redirect or recommit.

Beaver Valley is already showing signs of seizing the opportunity that God is more than able to inspire in the rebuild of our tornado damaged congregation. And I am struck by how unimportant the new building (structure) is in relation to the opportunity we now have to have long conversations about the fast changing, hurting world in which we live and the ministry that must be ours as we stay relevant in the work to which we are called.

On August 21, our fall schedule will begin in our new, long term, Sunday morning setting: Boom Funeral Home chapel. Our mission developing work is to act like we are brand new congregation, with doors wide open with the expectation that new people will seek and find a loving, caring people of faith in our temporary sanctuary.

We will need lots of teams of people each Sunday for the months ahead to:

- come early to place the "Beaver Valley is Alive!" signage along the highway,
- set up extra chairs in the chapel,
- get a great Sunday School lesson ready for parents with their children,
- get the life-streaming equipment up and ready, and, as we always have,
- get the coffee hour prepared.
- Put everything back and clean things up before we go home.

My sabbatical days, amid everything else, have been a remarkable experience for me. I have had a chance to get outside of Beaver Valley enough to gain some perspective on our ministry and see how solid it is, what kind of a base we must build upon and some real needs that have to be talked about openly in the coming months. Our ministry really is inside and outside our building, always with the goal of eventually coming together, "where two or three gather" (Matt. 18:20), trusting in Christ's presence in our lives.


#### Beaver Valley Welcome Campaign

Meals are delivered to the Splitrock Apartments entry at1100 Teakwood St about 11:50 am from the Active Generations in Sioux Falls.

Each day the red and blue bags are exchanged for fresh hot meals in the entry of Splitrock Apts. Keep track of your mileage and time each day.

There is a list of names and their addresses with directions on how to get to other apartments and private homes.

First deliver the meals within the Splitrock Apts, load your vehicle and deliver the rest of the meals in Brandon. Depending upon the number of people

receiving meals, it takes approximately one hour to deliver them.

It is a very rewarding experience and families with children may want to consider making it a family service project before school starts. Perfect for students in need of a service project!
