“What Will We Become?”

There are certainly times when a person or a family or a congregation is faced with such challenges that the future seems to be hanging in the balance. What will happen to me/us in the coming months? It's a fair question to ask. The fact that we don't have all the answers and need help facing our futures is a significant part of our confession.

One of the great themes of literature and theatre is the whole notion of “fate.” We as people of faith are certainly not immune from earthly challenges, but we are equipped with a promise that allows us to bravely trust that our “fate” has been determined already: we are God's children and “nothing in all of creation can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.” Rms 8:39.

A legendary moment in Martin Luther's life happened when, in the depths of his months in seclusion, he was in despair, tormented by the devil, then to take his ink well and throw it at “the ancient foe” that was haunting saying, “If you can tell me that I am a poor sinner, I on the other hand, can tell you that Christ died for sinners...let me rest in peace, for on Christ's shoulders, not on mine, lie all my sins.”

So, let me ask you Beaver Valley members: What will we become over the next decades? I think we would agree: The world is a dark, devilish foe in many ways. The Church is back on its heels trying to capture the simple truths of Jesus' life and deliver these life-giving teachings to a world that too often won't slow down and listen and serve. It would be easy to build walls and pray for the end to come as soon as it can (Several weeks ago I heard a pastor pray a terrible Advent prayer, he asking only for God to come as soon as possible and rescue a people trying to survive). But the truth is the Holy Spirit is in and among us ready to inspire and make us a healthy, happy servant people-- all those who cry out in Jesus' name for power and protection.

Let us be that people. We are entering a year of ministry that will be historic. As we celebrate our 150th anniversary as a congregation, we rebuild our ministry campus with the future in mind. What will we become? If we gather together--all hands on deck in 2023 and ask God to give us the strength to be busy and serving in this world as we wait for Jesus' return (working and serving not waiting and hiding), then the years will unfold as God intends.

I ask each member to start now this January and commit to being an alive, “on Christ's shoulders lie all my sins” people. If Beaver Valley packs the Boom Chapel on January 29th, first for worship and then for our annual meeting, and we ask God to help us be a living, serving, relevant-in-the-world people, we will be blessed by a God who will keep us all alive in the valley, growing into a faith provided.

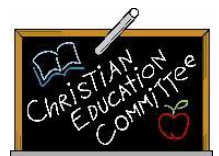


January 4th, Wednesdays, 6:30 p.m. – Wednesday Worship in Beaver Valley sanctuary
