

The Rebirth that is ours.

We are fresh off our shared celebration of Christmas. Whether our circumstances this past December were perfectly easy or remarkably hard, the truth is that the full gift of Christmas has come to us all. It's *all gift* this promise of a Christ-child born: new beginnings for the broken; hope again for the hopeless; light shining in the darkness; captives, says the prophet, "set free."

This theme we build upon into the new year. Added to the angel's promise of a Savior born is the Epiphany vision given to wisemen who were guided on their way after meeting the child Jesus. God "with us" is the important liturgical theme which guides our worship in January and beyond.

Certainly for our congregation--eager now to get back into what will feel like a new building in most ways—we have every right to talk emotionally about a rebirth. Part of this rebirth will be to open our eyes in the first several months of 2024 and regroup a little bit....try and figure out who is "in the pews" and who are we missing. It's been a long three and half years for our membership and we must be honest that the pandemic/tornado double whammy has been a challenge.

But by any measure we have, by the grace of God-with-us, done well. We should give thanks to God for the ministry that we have been a part of even as we ached for our church home to be ours again. Much of the good from our past we have found creative ways to keep going. God has helped us stay together!

But, in addition to giving thanks for the Spirit's inspiration to keep serving in many and various ways of old, we must be open to what God might be calling us to "do" and "be" as we face forward out into a world that most students of our culture will agree is changing very, very fast.

So, what will the reborn Beaver Valley look like by the end of 2024? I don't know anymore than most of you by yourselves could know. Discovery of purpose is best done together and is best shaped through the deep and steady worship and prayer life of a trusting congregation. At our annual meeting (Sunday, January 28th, 10:45 a.m.) we will consider a new budget for the new year. More than just a vote on how we will spend our money, an approved budget is really an approval of a plan for ministry. How will the daily life of our congregation support the faith-life of its members, but also be faithful to God's call to engage this often-confusing world? Followers of Jesus are not afraid to ask these questions knowing that God *is* with us as we re-emerge.

As we start our rebirth year, what I am sure of is this: the "new" Beaver Valley will work to both rekindle much of what we were doing faithfully before our walk in the wilderness began as well as expect to be surprised by God and what God will need us to do in the coming years. My January 2024 prayer is that we will be just as surprised as the Bethlehem shepherds were surprised by God's gift of grace that always leads people into joyous living.

With that said, as we now get the structure of the church fully restored and get more people back into specific leadership positions in the church and have a purposeful, "visioning" Lent (beginning already on Feb. 14th!) and dedicate the building on the second Sunday of Easter (April 7th) I pray that we will have the most fun we have ever had in being God's people in this place called Beaver Valley!

I do believe this is good advice to follow: as we begin 2024, let's stay prayerfully focused upon one thing-- the wonderful, God-led work of rebirth and discovery that will come from our very selves.


We will be finishing up our first Grief Support Group in January by meeting again on the 9^{th} and 16^{th} .
