Friends in Christ,

Greetings to each and every one of you from God our loving heavenly Father and our living Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I hope and pray that this article finds all of you well now that we are heading into October which is a very special month indeed!

One of the reasons that October is special is because we get the opportunity to celebrate our history as Lutherans! It was on October 31, 1517, that Martin Luther posted the 95 Theses on the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. That piece of paper started the Reformation in the Church, and it changed the world!

Luther never meant for the impact to be as drastic as it was. When Luther nailed his document to the door, he was looking for a conversation. He wanted to talk with the leaders of the Church about ways he thought Scripture was being misinterpreted, and people were being abused through these interpretations. Luther wanted this particular document (the 95 Theses) to serve as a starting point. In Luther's opinion, this type of conversation could lead to changes within the Church.

As we know, many of the Church leaders were not open to having this type of conversation. They were content with what the Church was doing, and they were okay with many of the practices Luther saw as abuses. Since these leaders were not open to having this dialogue, Luther's movement became more than just changing the Church Luther knew. Luther's movement created an entire set of denominations within what we have come to know as Protestantism.

As Luther continued to do his work, he came into contact with many other leaders who were interpreting Scripture in the ways they thought were best. They were given the freedom to be able to look at what God's Word says and to find ways to apply that Word to daily life. As these leaders did their work with the Bible, they began to grow into several different denominations. Like Lutherans, many of these denominations still exist today. We know some of them such as: Presbyterians, Reformed Churches, Baptists, and many others.

The effects of the Reformation did not remain within the Church. The secular world was also affected by this changing landscape. Until the Reformation, there was no such thing as separation of Church and state. Many people believed the Church and state served the same roles. Luther changed this by being clear about the fact that the Church and state are related but each serve distinct roles. The Church's main role is to proclaim the Gospel, and the state's role is to promote good and punish evil.

Luther did not want to be remembered for what he did. Luther wanted people to be

pointed toward Jesus Christ crucified. He wanted them to know that all their sins had been forgiven, and they were given new lives through Jesus' resurrection. This all happened as a free gift from God.

This month, we are invited to remember the Reformation and to give thanks to God for Luther and his work. As we do so, we are also pointed to the cross. We are reminded that we are forgiven and born anew each and every day!

Firing On All Cylinders...

Last fall, then-Church Council President David VandenHull asked for volunteers to take a look at the current methods used to engage our congregation to serve. Are those methods effective? User-friendly? Motivational? Communicated well? Welcoming of giftedness across the church family?

Over many months, our task force has tried to gather information through conversations with church members and council members, and reviewed the time and talent sheets and parish life group activity. Long story short, we concluded that the parish life group model, though good in theory, has fallen short in engaging people. We also had a "fresh eyes" look at our time & talent sheet that has been used for a number of years. We spent most of our time revamping this form to be an effective means to educate, motivate, and communicate all the ways that our church family members can "plug in" and be involved in the ministries of BVLC.

Our work has been reviewed by both last year's and this year's church councils, by our interim pastor, John Dalen, and now by Pastor Josh. Tweaks have been made all along the way. We've also added a section to gather information needed from each person/family for our church directory.

Our church has been through a lot these past few years—a tornado, nomadic worship spaces, a rebuild, a retiring pastor, an interim pastor, and a new pastor. And praise God, we are seeing an influx of new families! Rather than wait until November when the time & talent sheets typically go out, we are suggesting a church-wide "reboot" for volunteer opportunities, and be intentional in filling and refilling ministry areas ASAP!

Can you imagine a church where every person is involved in some way? Can you even imagine it? Let's do it...




